Strathallan School was founded in 1913 in Bridge of Allan, near Stirling, but quickly outgrew its original site. In 1920, the school moved to the Freeland Estate in Forgardenny, a few miles south east of Scotland's ancient capital the City of Perth.

The campus is ideally situated for accessing the rest of Scotland, whether you want to head north to the ski slopes or south to the political and cultural centres of Edinburgh and Glasgow. Today's travel connections are simple and regular, with frequent trains from Perth and buses through Forgardenny throughout the day.


Approximate Journey Times



Strathallan's academic provision is unique. In the Prep School we follow the Prep School Baccalaureate programme with its emphasis on a portfolio of learning and breadth of academic experience. Once in the senior school, pupils work towards GCSEs before opting in the Sixth Form for either A Levels or Scottish Highers and Advanced Highers. No other school offers this mix of academic opportunities; we offer differentiated academic pathways specifically designed to meet the needs of individual pupils.


